Most Items listed are in <u>no way necessary</u> to be purchased or required and are based on individual preferences. Please note some prices and dates are based on the 2022-2023 school year, and as a result may be subject to change.

December Graduates please continue to read emails and listen to dial-outs regarding announcements in the spring. It is your responsibility to contact your guidance counselor or Mrs. Amy Johnson (Ramsey Administrator), if you have any questions regarding graduation.

If you have not done so already, please sign up to use SchoolCash online. You should have received information via email regarding set up. Majority of our fees will be paid through this online service.

August/September:

- All students entering the twelfth grade are <u>required</u> to have a booster dose of the <u>meningococcal</u> <u>conjugate vaccine</u>. The student will not be allowed to start classes without this immunization or exemption. Please contact your health care provider or the Health Department if your child has not had these immunizations.
 - The Health Department Immunization Clinic does immunizations on Tuesday afternoons from 1:00-3:45.
- Senior Pictures-Price varies depending on photographer and package-student is responsible for ensuring the yearbook staff has their individual picture
 - The FINAL opportunity for seniors to have pictures taken by Lifetouch in order to meet the yearbook deadline will be August 23 and 30. You must make an appointment with Ms. Hensley in Law Office.
- Yearbook-\$75 (Yearbook price will increase as the school year proceeds.) All yearbooks will be purchased online:
- Parking Permit- \$55

Exam Exemption Policy- Please read carefully

Please keep in mind that exam exemptions are a privilege.

Only students <u>classified</u> as seniors will be allowed to be exempt from **four** exams. These exemptions will be entirely the students' choice, subject to the following restrictions. (Students may not exempt an SOL, Dual Enrollment, or Certification exam.)

- 1. If they have an A average in the class for the semester;
- 2. If they have a <u>B</u> average in the class and no discipline referrals whatsoever during the semester; or
- 3. If they have a <u>C average in the class, no discipline referrals, and have missed no more than four days of school during the semester.</u> (NOTE: excused <u>or unexcused</u>) (Quarantine days marked by FCHS will not factor into student attendance.)
- 4. Students who have more than 10 (excused <u>or</u> unexcused) absences, <u>regardless of course grade</u>, per semester in any class may not be exempt from the final exam in that class.
- 5. THE EXAM EXEMPTION PROCESS IS A PRIVILEGE THAT MUST BE EARNED THROUGH MAINTAINING EXEMPLARY ATTENDANCE, BEHAVIOR AND ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE. FAILURE TO MEET THE ESTABLISHED CRITERIA WILL RESULT IN THE LOSS OF THIS PRIVILEGE.

Definition of Discipline Referral:

- a) Seniors who have warnings or conferences WILL still be able to exempt final exams.
- b) Seniors assigned OSS, SLC, ISS, PM Detention, Lunch Detention, or Administrative Period Detention will **NOT** be able to exempt final exams.

IMPORTANT

- 1. Exam exemption letters must be signed by student *and* parent/guardian.
- 2. Students must not be on school grounds during the time of their exemption.
- 3. Any student needing alternate arrangements must see Ms. Holland for approval.
